ROCHDALE EARLY HELP NEIGHBOURHOODS

Information, advice and support for all families on early intervention, and preventative services they can access at a neighbourhood level through **Family Hubs**

Supporting Families Workers offer interventions in the home, Family Hubs/ appropriate venue, providing targeted time limited support to families with children 0-19 years (0-25 years SEND). Intervention accessed by families with an existing EHA through Neighbourhood Early Help Allocation panels.

Neighbourhood Early Help Workers provide advice and support for multiagency practitioners carrying out Early Help Assessments (EHA) and leading Team Around the Family meetings (TAF) or with using the Early Help Module (EHM).


Neighbourhood Early Help Workers provide information, advice, guidance and support for practitioners regarding families they may be concerned about, where they may feel 'stuck' or where they would be considering making a referral to the Early Help and Safeguarding Hub.


Neighbourhood Early Help Workers provide brokerage support for multiagency practitioners where a family have been referred to EHASH however they have an existing Early Help Assessment and do not met the threshold for children's social care intervention.

Children's Needs and Response Framework



Universal Low risk. Step up/Step down Needs and risks can be met by universal or simple. specific agency response.

Early Help

Low to medium risk. Step up/Step down These will be living in greater adversity than most other children or have a greater degree of vulnerability than most if their needs are nor clear, not known or not being met and multi-agency interventions is required, using the Early Help Assessment/Team Around the Family.

Child in Need

Medium and escalating risk. Step up/Step down Complex needs. They're experiencing sustained and persistent problem that has not been possible to resolve at previous levels. They're unlikely to meet developmental milestones without statutory assessment by a social worker and concerted, co-ordinated multi-agency support.



Child Protection

Significant unmet needs and are being subjected to high risk factors. Without a statutory co-ordinated response they will continue to suffer or be at risk of suffering significant harm. They'll be supported through Child Protection or Looked After process
